

A Ministry of Transformation

Several decades ago, it was common to see ads and billboards featuring rugged, handsome cowboys holding cigarettes. Sometimes the ads didn't even include a headline, only the picture of a cowboy and the advertiser's brand name: Marlboro.

These ads made Marlboro an industry leader. They implicitly promised that people who used the product would become rugged and independent like these cowboys. The imagery from the American West represented freedom, adventure, and independence. In a word, the ads promised *transformation*.

People who believed the ads were indeed transformed, but not in the way they wanted to be. Instead, many lost their health and freedom to nicotine addiction, becoming weak and dependent.

As a publisher, Christian Light offers a sort of transformation too, one that has our users' best interests at heart. We want people to experience the kind of transformation Paul describes in 2 Corinthians 3:18: "But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord."

Christian Light is a conservative Mennonite nonprofit organization with a ministry of academic and spiritual transformation. We offer curriculum, storybooks, books on Christian living, and other materials for families, schools, and churches.

We believe that books, whether storybooks or academic workbooks, can change lives. A book can instantly change the way we see the world. More often, though, change is slow and incremental, like the process of a child growing into an adult.

Transformation can be negative or positive. Years of interacting with a curriculum changes how students think. A secular curriculum influences students toward a secular mindset. In contrast, as students interact with Christian Light curriculum, they are transformed by internalizing Biblical values alongside academic concepts.

Beyond academics for school-age students, story-books and books about Christian living help readers grow. Reading good books broadens our horizons, helps us put ourselves in other people's shoes, and draws us toward God as we better understand Him and His ways.

At Christian Light, our desire is that you will find our products useful in the slow, steady transformation that God is working in your life and your children's lives.


Caleb's Cookies and Kittens

This account of Christianity from the end of the Reformation to the beginning of the twenty-first century helps us understand the influences that have shaped the landscape of the church as we know it today.




