In semesters past, school (and sleep!) had somehow always become more important to me than quality time for morning Bible reading, prayer, and meditation. Notice the word *quality*. Absent-mindedly reading a few verses while scarfing down eggs and sending upward flighty prayers like "Thank You for this day" and "Please help me pass this test!" may help keep one on spiritual life support, but it's not *quality*.

At first my flesh wrestled against this growing conviction. There are always viable excuses like needing to study or needing another hour or two of sleep. Life is always busy. I knew if God couldn't be first now in my young adult life, He would never be.

I made a new commitment. I told God I would meet Him every morning at my favorite nature park. So, I did. I suppose this was my next step . . . my next "challenge" pushing me to grow. Every morning I rose at 5:00, ate breakfast and drank coffee, and by 6:00 I was at a small nature reserve near my school.

I set aside 6:00-7:30 for my Father. This was my quiet time when I prayed, sang, studied my Bible, and meditated on the lessons God taught through nature. Often I would end up staying a few hours longer if my day could afford it—and surprisingly, I had plenty of time to spare for my studies, and my academic life thrived rather than suffered.

It didn't take long before I wished I had done this from the beginning. Though I had always wanted to,

I finally learned to make God my priority and fit school and social life in the cracks, rather than offering God the leftovers. I was so much happier and fulfilled! Life had so much purpose and meaning and joy. It wasn't because I was so spiritual. I simply put God first . . . and this caused my whole day to be focused on Him rather than the stresses of life.

I share this as part of my journey. It was a crucial time in my life when I sought the Lord and did much thinking and growing. I'm not saying one has to follow the above pattern to be close to God. Moreover, my devotional life hasn't always looked the same; it has sometimes flourished and other times floundered.

I would like to challenge youth to take the opportunities and time they have to seek the Lord while He may be found. We all need to seek Him and not give up in defeat. God is creative and expects us to be creative too. There is always a way to draw close to the Lord and keep His Word alive and near our hearts.


Where He Leads, I'll Follow


